CORONERS SERVICE REQUESTS HELP TO ID WOMAN

RICHMOND – The BC Coroners Service and the Integrated Homicide Investigation Team requests the public's assistance to identify a woman whose remains were found in Richmond on June 5, 2006.

She is an Asian or Indo-Canadian female, approximately 4'11"-5'3" (150cm-160cm), between 27 and 35 years of age. She was wearing a hooded sweatshirt (XS) with a "Baby Phat" cat logo sewn on the back, a "Zara" turtle neck long-sleeved shirt (S) and blue "No Baby No" denim jeans.
