



## Business Closures by Order of the Registrar under the Private Investigators and Security Agencies Act

**September 1, 2008 the Private Investigators Security Agencies Act (PISA) was replaced by the Security Services Act. The following business closures occurred under PISA.**

The Registrar may order the cancellation of a business licence or refuse to issue a business licence under the authority section 16 of the Private Investigators and Security Agencies Act. Such a decision of the Registrar was based on factors ranging from criminal activity, continued non-compliance with the Act, substantiated information from the police community, substantiated complaints from the public, and findings of our own enforcement investigators or a combination of several of these factors.

Between 2002 and 2007 the following businesses were closed by order of the Registrar:
