



# Specific Requirements and Training for a **CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION INSTALLER and ELECTRONIC LOCKING DEVICE INSTALLER.**

This is a simple outline of the requirements and training guidelines to do with these two particular security licence types – *Closed Circuit Television Installer* and *Electronic Locking Device (Access Control) Installer*. ## **DESCRIPTIONS:**

***Closed Circuit Television Installer*** — Selling, supplying, providing advice on, servicing or installing any closed circuit television equipment, device or system. (See *Security Services Regulation section 15(4) item 14.*)

***Electronic Locking Device Installer*** — Selling, supplying, providing advice on, servicing, installing, coding, recoding, making or otherwise providing a lock-operating device for an electronic locking device. (See *Security Services Regulation section 15(4) item 15.*)

## **TRAINING, EXPERIENCE and/or QUALIFICATIONS:**

No training or document required for these licence types.

## **REQUIREMENTS FOR KEEPING YOUR LICENCE:**

Licenses must comply with the Security Services Act and Regulations, which include, but are not limited to, the following requirements:

- Ensure all information the Registrar holds on you is up to date (residential address, any new criminal charges or convictions, a change in peace officer status, treatment for a mental condition or change in legal name).
- Keep the security worker licence current and carry the licence at all times when providing security work.
- Follow the Code of Conduct (in the Security Services Regulations), ensuring you carry out your work as a licensed security worker in a professional, honest and respectful way.
